Exodus – The Revealing of God’s Glory and His Design for the Chosen

“The Bush Who Still Calls” – Exodus 3:7-10

I. Introduction

A. The importance of calling.

1. Being called home for dinner.
2. We receive all kinds of calls each day.

B. Today we will take note of God’s call upon Moses.

1. Exodus 3:7-10

II. Exposition

A. Verse 7

1. “Surely, I have seen”
 - a. There is a Hebrew play on words.

B. Verse 8

1. “I have come down.”
2. “Land flowing with milk and honey.”
3. Pagan nations.
 - a. The description is geographical.
 - b. Seed conflict (Genesis 3:15).
 1. Note Genesis 9:19-27
 2. See Map.

C. Verses 9-10

1. “Oppressed” – squeezed painfully.
2. Verse 9 is mostly a repetition of verse 7.
 - a. John Currid
3. “I will send you.”
 - a. The crux of the burning bush episode.

III. The challenge of calling.

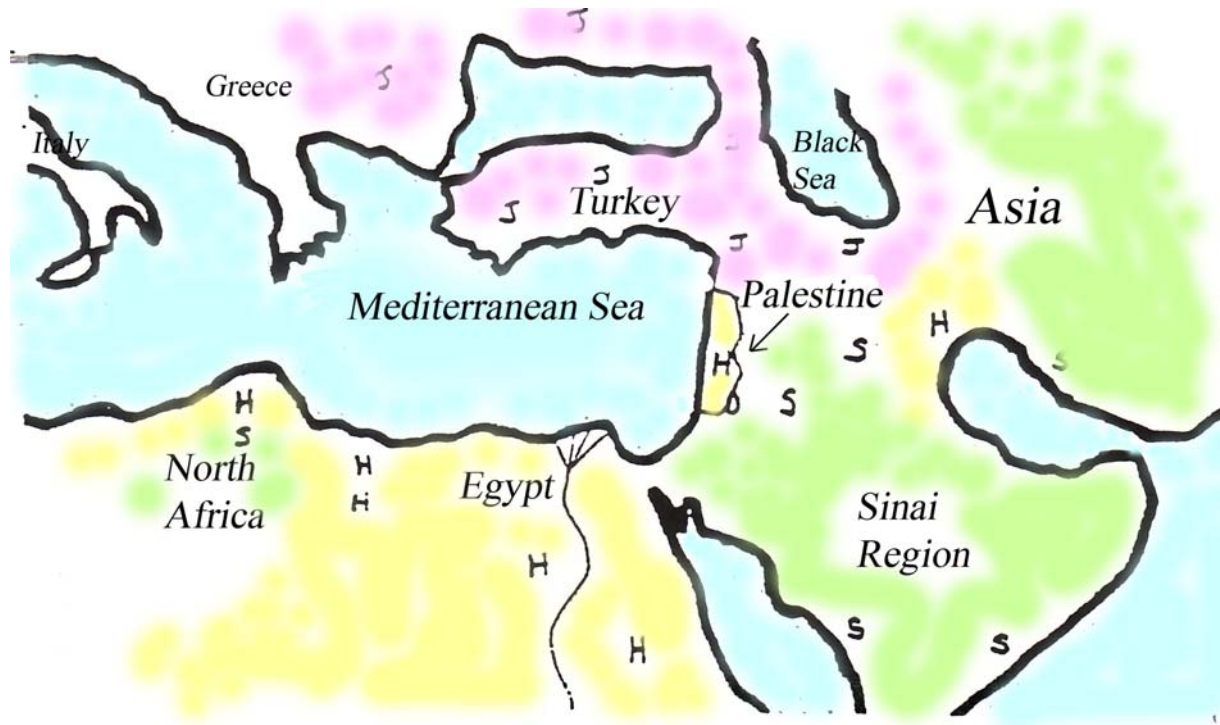
A. Moses’ calling is a reminder to us of the divine job that God has given to us.

1. There is a reminder here that each believer has a job to do.
2. What is your calling?
3. What helps us determine our call?
 - a. The Word of God – The burning bush is found in the Word of God which should be in your own heart.

B. Secondly, we have all been commissioned “to go bring out.”

1. Matthew 28:19-20
 - a. Ryken
 - b. Hindrances? – fear
2. Paul pondered over the deadness of his own people.
 - a. Romans 10:14-15
3. Paul on Paul
 - a. Ephesians 6:18-20

C. The bush is still burning.
