#25 – "Letting the Light Shine" – Luke 8: 16-21

- I. Introduction.
 - A. Opening illustration.
 - 1. A bloody day in 1862 but the night brought glorious sky.
 - B. Today's text Luke 8:16-21
- II. Exposition
 - A. Luke 8:16-18
 - 1. Note the importance of good listening.
 - 2. Context, noted with parable of the soils, suggests that

 Jesus is emphasizing the hearing and doing of the Word.
 - 3. The mini-parable
 - a. Why have something useful and not use it?
 - 4. Jesus' own teaching Luke 1:78, 2:32
 - 5. Some say the reference concerns the global missionary effort (Matthew 5:16).
 - a. Pastor Don disagrees The context of Luke's account is hearing and doing.
 - 6. Some people hear and hear and hear, but never do.

- 7. God will bring them to account Luke 8:17
 - a. Final judgment Psalm 7:9; 90:8; Eccl. 12:14; Rom. 2:16; I Cor. 4:5; Rev. 2:23
 - b. "Use it or lose it," Kent Hughes.
- 8. Haves and Have nots
 - a. "Haves" not materially but spiritually.

 They hear and do.
 - b. "Have nots" They hear but do not do.
- B. Luke 8:19-20
 - 1. This family concern seems out of place, but on closer examination it is a part of the narrative.
 - 2. We do not know why the family wanted to talk to Jesus.
- C. Luke 8:21
 - 1. Who is a true disciple? Or brother?
- III. Points for Reflection
 - A. How should we listen to sermons? Very carefully.
 - B. Do the Word attention to God's Word must be coupled with a willingness to do it!
 - C. Glorifying God means letting our light, the truth of His Word, shine through us!
