#78: "The Prophetic Autobiography"

Luke 20:9-18

### Luke 20:9-12

"<sup>9</sup> And He began to tell the people this parable: 'A man planted a vineyard and rented it out to vine-growers, and went on a journey for a long time. <sup>10</sup> At the harvest time he sent a slave to the vine-growers, so that they would give him some of the produce of the vineyard; but the vine-growers beat him and sent him away empty-handed. <sup>11</sup> And he proceeded to send another slave; and they beat him also and treated him shamefully and sent him away empty-handed. <sup>12</sup> And he proceeded to send a third; and this one also they wounded and cast out.'"

"<sup>8</sup> You removed a vine from Egypt;  
You drove out the nations

"<sup>14</sup> O God of hosts, turn again now,
