Luke 22:21-22

“²¹ But behold, the hand of the one betraying Me is with Mine on the table. ²² For indeed, the Son of Man is going as it has been determined; but woe to that man by whom He is betrayed!”

“²³ ...this Man, delivered over by the predetermined plan and foreknowledge of God, you nailed to a cross by the hands of godless men and put Him to death.”

“³ Then when Judas, who had betrayed Him, saw that He had been condemned, he felt remorse and returned the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders, ⁴ saying, ‘I have sinned by betraying innocent blood.’ But they said, ‘What is that to us? See to that yourself!’ ⁵ And he threw the pieces of silver into the temple sanctuary and departed; and he went away and hanged himself.”

“²⁵ And Judas, who was betraying Him, said, ‘Surely it is not I, Rabbi?’ Jesus said to him, ‘You have said it yourself.’”

“²⁷ After the morsel, Satan then entered into him. Therefore Jesus said to him, ‘What you do, do quickly.’ ²⁸ Now no one of those reclining at the table knew for what purpose He had said this to him. ²⁹ For some were supposing, because Judas had the money box, that Jesus was saying to him, ‘Buy the things we have need of for the feast’; or else, that he should give something to the poor. ³⁰ So after receiving the morsel he went out immediately; and it was night.”

“²³ And they began to discuss among themselves which one of them it might be who was going to do this thing. ²⁴ And there arose also a dispute among them as to which one of them was regarded to be greatest.”

Luke 9:46-48 (Matthew 18:1-5)

“⁴⁶ An argument started among them as to which of them might be the greatest. ⁴⁷ But Jesus, knowing what they were thinking in their heart, took a child and stood him by His side, ⁴⁸ and said to them, ‘Whoever receives this child in My name receives Me, and whoever receives Me receives Him who sent Me; for the one who is least among all of you, this is the one who is great.’”

Matthew 20:20-24 (Mark 10:35-45)

“²⁰ Then the mother of the sons of Zebedee came to Jesus with her sons, bowing down and making a request of Him. ²¹ And He said to her, ‘What do you wish?’ She said to Him, ‘Command that in Your kingdom these two sons of mine may sit one on Your right and one on Your left.’ ²² But Jesus answered, ‘You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I am about to drink?’ They said to Him, ‘We are able.’ ²³ He said to them, ‘My cup you shall drink; but to sit on My right and on My left, this is not Mine to give, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared by My Father.’ ²⁴ And hearing this, the ten became indignant with the two brothers.”

“^{33b} ...He began to question them, ‘What were you discussing on the way?’ ³⁴ But they kept silent, for on the way they had discussed with one another which of them was the greatest.”

Luke 22:25-26

“²⁵ And He said to them, ‘The kings of the Gentiles lord it over them; and those who have authority over them are called “Benefactors.”’ ²⁶ But it is not this way with you, but the one who is the greatest among you must become like the youngest, and the leader like the servant.’”
