Romans 6:1-2

“¹ What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase? ² May it never be! How shall we who died to sin still live in it?”

Romans 6:2b

“² ...How shall we who died to sin still live in it?”

**The Christian is no longer
responsive to sin.**

J. B. Philips translation

Verse 7 – “a dead man can safely be said to be immune to the power of sin.”

Verse 11 – “Dead to the appeal and power of sin.”

Romans 6:11-13

“¹¹ Even so consider yourselves to be dead to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus. ¹² Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its lusts, ¹³ and do not go on presenting the members of your body to sin as instruments of unrighteousness; but present yourselves to God as those alive from the dead, and your members as instruments of righteousness to God.”

The Christian should die to sin.

Romans 6:12

“¹² Therefore do not let sin reign in your mortal body so that you obey its lusts.”

Romans 6:13a

“¹³ and do not go on presenting the members of your body to sin as instruments of unrighteousness....”

**The Christian is dying
to sin day by day.**

**The Christian cannot
continue to sin, because
he has renounced it.**

The Christian has died to sin's guilt.

Verse 2b

“^{2b} ...How shall we who died to sin still live in it?”

Verse 10

“¹⁰ For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all; but the life that He lives, He lives to God.”
