

## Moving on with Christ While Recognizing Our Death to Sin

Part IV: Romans 6:1-14

### **Romans 6:3-4a**

“<sup>3</sup> Or do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death? <sup>4</sup> Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death...”

### **Romans 6:4b**

“<sup>4b</sup> ...so that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.”

### **Romans 6:5-10**

“<sup>5</sup> For if we have become united with Him in the likeness of His death, certainly we shall also be in the likeness of His resurrection, <sup>6</sup> knowing this, that our old self was crucified with Him, in order that our body of sin might be done away with, so that we would no longer be slaves to sin; <sup>7</sup> for he who has died is freed from sin. <sup>8</sup> Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him, <sup>9</sup> knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, is never to die again; death no longer is master over Him. <sup>10</sup> For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all; but the life that He lives, He lives to God.”

“If we are united with Him in His death...”

Second part –

“... we will certainly also be united with Him in His resurrection.”

**Romans 6:6-7**

“<sup>6</sup> knowing this, that our old self was crucified with Him, in order that our body of sin might be done away with, so that we would no longer be slaves to sin; <sup>7</sup> for he who has died is freed from sin.”

Old self = old nature

**The Bible never tells us to crucify the old man.**

Sin in the body

**Romans 6:5-10**

“That our old self was crucified with Him, that our body of sin might be done away with.”

Adam – Able to sin.

POSSE PECCARE

Adam after the fall – not able to not sin.

NON POSSE NON PECCARE

The believer –Able to not sin.

POSSE NON PECCARE

Glorified state –Not able to sin.

NON POSSE PECCARE

**Romans 6:8-10**

“<sup>8</sup> Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him, <sup>9</sup> knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, is never to die again; death no longer is master over Him. <sup>10</sup> For the death that He died, He died to sin once for all; but the life that He lives, He lives to God.”

**Philippians 3:10**

“<sup>10</sup> ...that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death.”

**Know...**

Verse 2 – “Or do you not know”

Verse 6 – “For we know that our old self was crucified with Him.”

Verse 9 – “<sup>9</sup> knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, is never to die again; death no longer is master over Him.”
