

Pastor Don's Updated Must Read Book List

NORTH AMERICAN CHRISTIANITY AND CULTURE:

Christless Christianity by Michael Horton. The author shows how the American church's abandonment of Biblical and theological preaching has resulted in an alternative gospel. The work is well done and very understandable.

Amusing Ourselves to Death by Neil Postman. Published by Penguin Books. This is not a Christian work, but very pertinent for Christians living in this culture. Deals with the affects of television on critical thinking.

Why Johnny Can't Preach by T. David Gordon. This is an interesting little book where the author demonstrates how the media has shaped most evangelical sermons. The result has been starved sheep.

This Little Church Stayed Home by Gary E. Gilley. The author chronicles the rise of the seeker sensitive church model within Evangelicalism. In an effort to become relevant to the culture, many Evangelical congregations have lost the meaning of the gospel.

Selling out the Church by Philip D. Kenneson and James L. Street. The authors reveal the dangers to orthodox Christianity when congregations adopt secular marketing techniques.

THEOLOGY:

The Reformed Study Bible Published by P & R Publishing. An excellent study aid. The contributors are not afraid to take a position. The only Reformed Theological Study Bible published. The original Geneva Bible with notes was the Bible of the Puritans and original Pilgrims.

Knowing God by J.I. Packer. A great book on the attributes of God. Intervarsity Press

The Sovereignty of God by A.W. Pink. The best there is on this topic. It is loaded with Scripture references. You will be amazed!

Christ of the Covenants by O. Palmer Roberston. This is a great intro to Covenant history and theology.

Foundations of the Christian Faith by James Boice. This pastor and theologian has greatly influenced Pastor Don. This work is great on the basics of Christianity.

The Five Points of Calvinism by David N. Steele. Understand your faith.

Putting Amazing Back into Grace by Michael Horton. Published by Baker. Concerns God's sovereign work in salvation and calls into question evangelical techniques in evangelism that may not be biblical.

The Holiness of God by R. C. Sproul. Still considered the best work on the topic for the layman. Worshipping God is inevitable after reading this book.

Chosen by God by R. C. Sproul. The layman's guide to understanding predestination and election.

UNDERSTANDING SELF:

The Search for Significance by Robert S. McGee. The most competent book I've read on self-esteem concerns. This work is underpinned well with scripture and theology.

Designed For Dignity by Richard Pratt. An excellent book on self-concept issues. Pratt is a master at word pictures. You will look at your life and role in the world differently after reading this book.

Knowing Man by J.I. Packer. This is out of print, but may be found online at a used book source. It is worth the search.

What is a Family by Edith Schaeffer (Francis Schaeffer's wife) Diedre says that this book offers practical suggestions on how to create a Christian home. She had some thoughts as a young wife and mother, but says that this book gave her the outline, so to speak, to begin to develop her family's traditions, family bonds, etc. She believes it should be given to every new bride.

Federal Husband by Doug Wilson. Job description for men.

THE CHURCH:

The Communion of the Saints by Phillip Graham Ryken. What does it mean to be a part of a church? This question and much more explained.
